What is the Last Planner System?

The Last Planner System (LPS) is an essential first step to delivering a project on a Lean basis. LPS improves coordination by producing predictable workflow and rapid learning. The system operates as a series of connected conversations that establish what should be done, what can be done so that the Last Planner, the person making can make a reliable promise for its completion. LPS is not a computer system. It is a set of protocols corresponding, phase pull Planning, look ahead planning, assignment preparation and reporting complete.



Who is Dean Reed?

This month Dean Reed will be joining us from Redwood City, California to share with us on this topic. Dean Reed is DPR Construction's Lean Construction Coordinator and works with project teams across the country to implement Collaborative Virtual Building and Lean Construction principles and tools. Most recently, he facilitated DPR's Lean project delivery of the Camino Medical Group Mountain View Campus, a \$100 million state-of-the-art Healthcare center. With more than 35 years of experience, Reed has focused the last 20 years on project planning and is a founding member of the Virtual Builders Roundtable, a group of owners and industry professionals dedicated to promoting virtual building by creating 3D models of building projects linked to construction schedules. Reed is also a member of the Lean Construction Institute and a graduate of the "Shusa II" advanced lean implementation and leadership program.

Directions

From I-5 Northbound

- Take Hwy 518 Westbound to Hwy 509.
- Curve Right to Hwy 509 onramp
- Take 1st Exit to S. 128th St.
- Turn Right onto S. 128th St.
- Turn Left Immediately onto 8th Ave S.
- Turn Right at first stop onto S 112th St.
- Turn left into Second Drive-way for Glen Acres.

From I-5 Southbound

- Take the Michigan St Exit.
- Turn Right at bottom of the off-ramp onto Michigan St.
- At 3rd light take soft right onto 1st South Bridge.
- Follow Hwy 509 Southbound and exit Glendale Ave S.
- Turn Left at bottom of off ramp and go straight through the stoplight.
- Turn left into second driveway for Glen Acres.



Please Note: If you have turned into the driveway to find a locked gate, turn right immediately into the parking lot and follow driveway to the country club. You do not need to pass through the gate in order to get to the country club.
