# **Another Outstanding Lean in Design Forum Program**

the need for a fuller discourse on Lean, as well as the myriad language issues that arise when different terms mean different things to different people and functions in our business. He also said a potential positive side benefit of Lean could come in the form of a reinvigorated engineering function with more ability to assert itself in the process (as had been more the case in the past). He also took an interesting side-swipe at the "8 Wastes," a pillar of Lean practice as developed by the Japanese, noting instead there is an overarching "9<sup>th</sup> Waste": inadequate/missing human conversation resulting from things like inadequate listening, mistrust, etc.
